

What wilt thou that I should do unto thee?

Mark 10:45-52

Key Verse is 51

1. What this question DID:

- It brought out two Personalities.
"What wilt thou that I should do unto thee?"
It was just him and Jesus, they forgot crowd.
It's the same for us every time we come to church. (Jesus & me)
- It displayed Christ's boundless Power. (vs. 50 & 2 Peter 3:9)
If there's any limit, it will be in our prayer, not in His power.
May we never be counted in the "many" that discourage others (vs. 48)
Don't let anything hold you back from seeking Christ (vs. 50)
- It focused the blind man on the Blessing he needed.
"Lord, that I might receive my sight."
Jesus knew what he needed, but he wanted to see if Bartimaeus knew.

2. What this question Teaches Us:

- Prayer should be Personal.
"What wilt thou that I should do unto thee?"
How often when prayer is being led are we actually praying as well?
- Prayer should be a distinct act of your Own Will.
"What wilt thou that I should do unto thee?"
Luke 11:9 "Ask...seek...knock" are not just wants but actions
- Prayer is linked to our faith and we should Expect God to answer.
vs. 52 "thy faith hath made thee whole" He had "whole" faith.

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
