

## Overcoming the World

1 John 5:1-5

Look at the train of thought in verses 3 and 4. Here's the process of thought: First, "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous." Second, "For whatsoever is been born of God overcometh the world." Third, "and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith."

1. Love for God is shown by \_\_\_\_\_.

Obey God's commandments without a spirit of it being burdensome. Verse 3: "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous." The mark of love for God is joyful obedience, not begrudging obedience.

Verse 4a: "*For* [signifying the basis of what went before!] whatsoever is been born of God overcometh the world." Our love for God obeys him freely and joyfully because in salvation the allure of the world is broken and it loses its power. When the world loses its powerful attraction because of salvation, God and his holiness will become attractive. Not burdensome. How does this work?

3. This world-defeating power \_\_\_\_\_.

Verse 4b: "and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." The Gospel, Salvation, Faith, and Obedience with Joy in that order. So the train of thought goes like this: Salvation happens as we are brought into contact with the life changing Gospel of Christ. The first effect of this salvation is that we see and receive God, through Christ and desire to do His will because it's attractive and important to us. That's faith. This faith overcomes the world, that is, it overcomes the enslaving power of the world to be our heart's desire. Faith breaks the enslaving attraction of the world. By doing that, faith leads us into obedience with freedom and joy. God and His holiness will look beautiful and not burdensome. Salvation has taken the blinders off. We see things for what they are. We are free to obey with joy.

May God confirm this spiritual reality of every born-again Believer at Emmanuel by overcoming the power of the world in our lives. "For whatsoever is been born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, *even our faith.*"
